The Westmont Rotary Club awards grants to high school seniors who are planning to continue their education beyond high school.

ELIGIBILITY

Students must:

1. Reside in corporate limits of Westmont or attend Westmont High School.
2. Be in the top 25% of their class.
3. Be involved in extracurricular activities.
4. Be involved in service related activities at school and/or in the community (leadership roles are a plus).

REQUIREMENTS

Students must:

1. Submit a completed application.
2. Submit a well composed essay.
3. Submit a copy of his/her current high school transcript.
4. Finalists will be selected to give a three to five minute speech at a Rotary Club luncheon. This presentation will be based on the question: what does Rotary's *Four Way Test* mean to you? Candidates must prepare a well thought-out response on the topic.

Rotary's Four Way Test

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

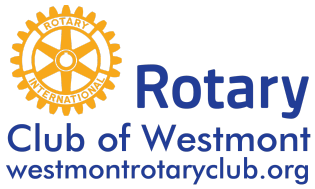
